The single greatest factor determining the likelihood of high school graduation is school attendance. Opportunities for success during and beyond secondary school are also directly affected by a student's attitude toward attendance in high school. In order to afford students the opportunity to be academically successful and responsible citizens, The High School expects students to be in class, prepared, and on time each day.

During the worldwide pandemic effectively managing school attendar became a significant factor in terms of trying to curb the spread of disease. Schools attripted develop different methods of instruction to try and meet the various needs of families. In an effort to proactively support student at ndance "inh School III provide positive reinforcements to those students who keep their atter in the with the established thresholds. Each semester, the High School A ninit is atter in atter ways to reward all students that have maintained in 90% atter ance in all classes and also did not exceed the tardy threshold in any right seach mester.

High School supports s. and dir policies which call for fairness and to provide flexibility and accountability part of students, parents, and the school. Attendance is a student-parent responditive which involves all three entities in order to resolve attendance incerns. I tents we demonstrate excessive attendance problems (defined as unexcusive absences and dies) we be subject to potential school disciplinary actions.

Research shown that so of performance significantly declines once a student exceeds a 10% absented te. Studer should be in attendance no less than 90% of the time. This includes both ex = 3d c unexcused absences. If students fall below the 90% threshold, they are increasing the normal for high school.

Each student is expected to keep their attendance under the following thresholds per quarter:

1. No more than 5 unexcused absences per class period during the duration of each quarter.

No more than 7 tardies per class period during the duration of each quarter.
No more than a combination of 2 verified truancies in all class periods during the duration of each quarter.

Absences

Any time a student misses class it will be recorded as an absence. P ts must call in or use the secure email through Skyward to communicate with our attending the absence. Once the absence is excused it will be recorded in Skyward as an " As per state code, students will be held harmless for absences that are *r* used by a parent quardian. This does not mean that students are not responsible to opplete any work that is issed as a result of absences. Students are expected to complet , work, rec rdless of the type of absence that is recorded. Any absence that is not exc. d by a , ent or guardian will be recorded in Skyward as an "A". Once a student exceeds Jused absences in any class during a quarter, they will advance to a Tier 1 attendance in antion. Parents may excuse absences through the attendance office fo five days afte. r absence occurred. After five days have passed, absences must be clear ' by u. indents' as ... ant principal.

Verified Truancies

A student w. is supposed be in class but is found elsewhere in the building without an appropriate hall is swill in marked as verified truant. These are typically the most problematic absences in a screen ing as most verified truancies are a result of students not going to class but remaining in one building in locations where they are not supposed to be. Because these absences are so problematic the threshold for this type of absence is very low. Once a student exceeds 2 verified truancies in any combination of classes they will advance to a Tier 1 attendance intervention.

Tardies

Punctuality is an important life skill and tardiness is extremely disruptive to the educational process. A student is considered tardy if they are not in the classroom when the bell rings. If a

student arrives more than 10 minutes late to class it is recorded as a "W" which refers to "Way Late". This still only counts as a tardy but serves as a reference for teachers, students, and families regarding the significance of the late arrivals. Any student that exceeds 7 tardies in the same class period during a quarter will advance to a Tier 1 attendance intervention.

Check in / Check Out

Students arriving to school late or returning to school from a mid-day appointment should check in at the office. Parents need to call and notify the attendance office when for tudent is being checked in so we can record it appropriately. Students arriving late to close without parent notification will be marked with a tardy as described above.

Education Release

Some students have a form of education release in their redule. Education release includes but is not limited to work release, home release, class at CTEC, and seminary. Students should be at the designated location for their educatio. Nease a not at High School High. CTEC students returning to High School after their CTEC as must go to the media center until their next scheduled class. CTEC students will receive adge from CTEC that will be their pass to the media center.

Pre-Interventions: Once a sturing acceede unexcused absences, 1 verified truancy, or 5 tardies in any of their class, the school will const the student and the parent regarding the student's attendance. T' school will scuss the clents' attendance and schedule an additional meeting if furce support

Tier 1: Once a r' thas excided 5 unexcused absences, 2 verified truancies, or 7 tardies in any of their ases, the timinist on will schedule an attendance meeting with the student and the r ant. At this me of we we discuss the students current grades and attendance and potential of the attendance problem.

Tier 2. Once and dent has a ceeded the 8 unexcused absences, 10 tardies or 4 verified truancies in any control with the student and the control will schedule an attendance mediation with the student and the control this mediation we will discuss the students current grades and attendance and potential solutions to the attendance problem. At this mediation, the student and parent will agree to and sign an attendance contract indicating what measures will be put into place to help the student to improve attendance efforts, a time frame for compliance, and the potential consequences for further attendance deficiencies.

Tier 3: When a student fails to meet the terms of the Tier 2 attendance contact and continues to struggle with attendance and/or tardies, we will schedule a second attendance mediation with the student and the parent. At this second mediation we will

impose the consequences agreed upon in the first contract and work on a contract with more significant potential consequences for failure to comply. At this mediation, the student and parent will agree to and sign the attendance contract indicating what measures will be put into place to help the student to improve attendance efforts, a time frame for compliance, and the potential consequences for further attendance deficiencies.

Some of the potential consequences that may be contained in the Tier 1 and Tier 2 attendance contracts include but are not limited to:

- Placement on a daily attendance tracker
- Lunch Detention
- In-School Suspension
- Referral to Mentor or "check and connect" course or
- Revoked parking privileges
- Revoked participation at school dances/sr __tator privileges at UH_ ` activities
- Assignment of a class escort
- Suspension from participation in UHSA anction activities
- Other consequences developed in collabo
