- Staff presentation on proposed tax increase Leon Wilcox, Business Administrator Ms. Oaks joined the meeting electronically.

Mr. Wilcox presented a timeline of the Truth-in-Taxation process with a list of dates and items discussed along with communication details provided to the public.

Utah law establishes a certified rate system for property tax which generates the same tax revenue for the taxing entity as the previous year, with an allowance for new property growth. It is customary for local governments, including school districts, to increase taxes to capture inflation. Canyons School District has exceeded the certified rate and held a tax hearing only three times in its 17 years of existence. The "Canyons School Deb Svce" listed on property tax notices is to pay the principal and interest payments on voter-approved bonds from 2010 and 2017. Mr. Wilcox reviewed the inflation impact on the District and indicated the trend decreasing in buying power.

The purpose of the proposed \$6,633,200 tax increase is to cover operational and capital costs. These expenses include partially funding a 1.5% cost of living adjustment for employees (total cost \$4.1M), an increase in insurance costs (\$2.1M), and add 13 new elementary assistant principal (\$1.2M). In addition, the tax will cover inflationary costs for utilities, supplies and curriculum (\$585,000) and the bond payment for the newly acquired Innovation Center (\$2,555,000).

If the market value shown on the property valuation notice is higher than what individuals think their property is worth, they should appeal to the Board of Equalization. The appeal forms and instructions are available at: <u>Salt Lake County Board Equalization</u>. The deadline for appeal is September 15, 2025. Residents can apply for statutory tax relief through the <u>Salt Lake County Treasurer</u>. The Deadline for application is September 1, 2025.
