#### 8. New Business

A. Process for renaming the New White City area elementary school – Mr. Wilcox, Business Administrator

Mr. Wilcox explained that during the summer the Administration will work with Ms. Julie Winfree, the principal of the new school to facilitate focus groups to identify potential names and mascots for the new school. The administration will report back to the Board of Education and survey the community of the schools to receive feedback. The Board will be presented the results of the process in a future board meeting for approval. B. 2020-2021 Budget Review (Second Reading) – Leon Wilcox, Business Administrator Mr. Wilcox updated the Board of Education on potential State funding reductions due to the COVID 19 effect on tax revenues. The Legislature is expected to hold a special session in mid-June to determine Education funding budget totals.

The District has been instructed to budget on the same WPU and state funding amount as 2019-2020 school year. Salaries and benefits comprise 88.6% of the budget and the funding shortfall will impact salary negotiations. The Federal CARES Act funding, \$2.4 M distributed to the District, will help assist with student academic catch-up, SEL supports, principal needs, technology and custodial support. Mr. Wilcox presented an overview of the District's budget practices and FY21 projected tax rates.

The Budget Hearing will be held on Tuesday, June 9, 2020 to propose adoption of the 2020-2021 budget and a final 2019-2020 Budget. The budget will be available for inspection 15 days prior to adoption.
